PASTOR FAILS TO GET BOND

**Zion Minister Stays in
Jail; Wife Teaches
His Class.**

CHICAGO, May 28.—(AP)—Rev. Finis Jennings Dake, 35, pastor of the Christian Assembly church of Zion, Ill., was held in jail here today awaiting removal to Milwaukee where he was charged with violation of the Mann act.

Federal authorities said the real estate the pastor offered for his \$2,000 bond was insufficient and as a result his wife took charge of his Bible class last night.


Denies Immorality Charge.

Dake agreed to permit his removal to Milwaukee where a federal grand jury indicted him last February on a charge of transporting a 16-year-old girl from Kenosha, Wis., to East St. Louis, Ill., for immoral purposes. He denied the accusation to interviewers.

"I did take her there," Dake said. "But there was no immorality involved. I wanted to get her a job."

The minister had attributed his interest in the girl, federal authorities said, as based solely on a desire to help her from an unhappy home life.
